Ontario Clinical Exam (OCE) Updates

A lot has happened since the launch of the Ontario Clinical Exam in October 2022. Here's a quick snapshot of the progress so far, and the next steps for the exam.

- To date 291 candidates have attempted the Ontario Clinical Exam. Results from the October and November exams were released on January 24.
- The exams scheduled for March 9 and 10, 2023 will be the final exams with candidates on site in Toronto. After the March exams, the Ontario Clinical Exam will switch to a fully virtual format. Virtual exams are scheduled throughout 2023 and 2024. See a list of dates here.
- <u>Registration for the virtual exam</u> opened on January 12, 2023. More than 200 applications have been submitted.
- Some PT Residents are still pursuing the <u>Exam Exemption Policy</u> and must submit an application under the policy by the March 31, 2023 deadline.

 Provisional Practice certificates have been extended for PT Residents who have registered for the Ontario Clinical Exam, or declared that they are pursuing the Exam Exemption Policy.

More information about the virtual Ontario Clinical Exam will be added to the website as it becomes available.

Annual Renewal and PISA Open on February 1, 2023

Annual Renewal 2023

Each year all PTs registered in Independent Practice are required to complete the annual renewal process which involves reviewing and verifying your personal and employment information, and paying your annual registration fee.

The 2023 annual renewal process will run from February 1 to March 31. The fee this year is \$635.

All PTs in Independent Practice must complete annual renewal and pay the registration fee by 11:59 p.m. on March 31 to avoid additional late fees.

PISA 2023

The Professional Issues Self Assessment (PISA) runs concurrently with annual renewal between February 1 and March 31. PISA is a mandatory self-reflection exercise that all PTs must complete each year. This includes people with both Provisional Practice and Independent Practice certificates.

While PISA is mandatory, it is not scored so there is no pass or fail. There are 13 multiple choice questions designed to get you thinking about the standards and resources and how to apply them in your practice.

Fees, Billing and Accounts Standard

Physiotherapists are accountable for any fee, billing or account that uses their name and registration number.

The Fees, Billing and Accounts Standard details the responsibilities of a physiotherapist to ensure that all fees are accurate for the services provided, and that fees are appropriately communicated to patients. The standard also specifies that PTs should always be aware of how their name and registration number are being used.

Advice from the Practice Advisors when it comes to fees, billing and accounts:

Physiotherapists must ensure that any fee, billing or account that uses their name and registration number is an accurate reflection of the services and/or products provided.

Physiotherapists must never charge fees or create billings or accounts that are inaccurate, false or misleading.

Stop: Assuming that front desk staff or office managers are adequately auditing invoices billed under your registration number.

Start: Doing regular audits of invoices and billing practices to ensure accuracy and should any inaccuracies be discovered, take reasonable steps to correct the error.

Check/Renew Your Liability Insurance

Reminder: you will be asked to confirm that you have a liability insurance policy that meets the College's requirements when you renew your registration. Take a second to check or renew your policy now.

Your liability insurance must include:

- A minimum coverage of \$5 million dollars for the annual policy period
- A liability limit of at least \$5 million dollars per incident
- No additional terms, conditions or exclusions, other than standard
- No deductible
- Tail insurance for a minimum of 10 years

Check with your employer to see if they have a policy that protects you. If it doesn't, it's your responsibility to arrange your own.

About Elections

Bill 106: Updates to Registration Timelines

In 2022, the Ontario government introduced <u>Bill 106</u> which included changes to the Regulated Health Professions Act.

Notably, Bill 106 (The Pandemic and Emergency Preparedness Act) includes updated requirements for registration timelines.

As of January 1, 2023, the College will respond to all applications for registration within 15 days. Complete applications will also be processed within 15 days. This includes applications for Provisional and Independent Practice.
